GRAVEL PLAN CAMPAIGNERS CLOSER TO VICTORY

CAMPAIGNERS HAVE MOVED one step closer to winning their battle to stop a quarry being located in Fritton Woods.

Conservative County Councillors have stopped the controversial plan following a massive 14,000-signature petition and pressure from Prospective MP, Brandon Lewis.

The grass-roots campaign won praise from County Council leader, Daniel Cox, who said: 'Local residents have fought an impressive campaign in getting their message across. Brandon Lewis has also piled on the pressure – that's why the plans are not in the next round of consultation.'

Welcoming the decision, Brandon said: 'I have supported local campaigners in their fight to publicise the plight of Fritton Woods from the outset. Over the summer, I have made sure the decision makers in County Hall heard their powerful argument.'

HOSPICE CARE NEEDED IN GREAT YARMOUTH

PROSPECTIVE MP, BRANDON LEWIS, has highlighted the lack of end-of-life care in Great Yarmouth during a recent visit to James Paget Hospital.

Currently there is no in-patient hospice care available in the area to provide vital support to people with terminal illnesses and their families and carers.

'Every one of us has been affected by a close relative or friend dying from an illness like cancer,' says Brandon. 'Hospices make a huge difference during an often distressing and highly emotional time.'

'The staff at the James Paget Hospital provide world-class treatment and care. However, patients in this area are denied an important choice about where they wish to die. A local hospice would change this.'
